

Top Tips For Preparing For School

Read books about starting school and talk to your child about what to expect.

We recommend "Olu's Teacher" by Jamel C Campbell



Explain to your child that in school they will be able to make new friends, learn new things, and have fun!

Prompt your child to take ownership of their belongings, by encouraging them to put away toys and clothes. This can help them feel more confident and independent.

Encourage you child to play with other children, either at home or in a Stay and Play session. This will help your child develop their social skills in things like sharing, taking turns, and cooperation.

Celebrating Children's World In The City


Children at Barbican Playgroup have been designing and creating with a variety of construction resources .



Children use construction toys to express their creativity and imagination, as they design and build whatever they like, without limitations.



Building with construction toys helps children develop their fine motor skills, hand -eye coordination, and dexterity as they manipulate small pieces, such as blocks, Lego bricks and 2D shapes.



Construction toys provide opportunities for children to practice problem-solving skills, such as planning, designing, and building structures, bridges, or other creations. This also teaches children about different concepts, such as science, technology, engineering and maths, in a fun and engaging way.
